Feral Cat Spay/Neuter Project

WHAT IS A FERAL CAT?



Feral cats are the offspring of stray or abandoned domestic cats who revert to a wild state. They often form colonies around a food source. Feral cats are typically raised with no human contact, which can make it difficult but not impossible to domesticate them. We prefer to call them "free roaming" cats to include ones who are unowned but socialized to people.

WHY DO THEY NEED OUR HELP?

Left unaltered, feral cats continue to reproduce, contributing to the estimated 750,000 homeless cats living in the Puget Sound region.

Through trap, spay/neuter and return (TNR or TAR), feral cats live out their lives

without adding to the homeless cat population. After surgery, free roaming cats gain weight and live healthier lives. TNR programs are proven to stabilize and significantly reduce feral cat colonies. By limiting feral cat numbers, fewer unwanted and homeless cats are taken to shelters and euthanized.

HOW DOES THE PROJECT WORK?

FERAL AND FREE ROAMING CATS

The Feral Cat Spay/Neuter Project offers FREE spay/neuter services for feral or free roaming cats in a safe, high quality, humane environment. During our regularly scheduled clinics, cats receive a basic health exam, rabies vaccination and spay/neuter surgery. We also perform an ear tip to clearly identify the cat as altered in order to avoid future trapping/transport for surgery that isn't needed. These services are all free of charge.

FERAL CAT PREVENTION SERVICES

Because unaltered tame cats are the original source of feral and free roaming cats, we offer spay/neuter services without ear tipping for tame cats. We emphasize altering before adoption for rescue groups, shelters and grassroots rescuers but offer spay/neuter to all individuals with kittens or tame cats that need access to spay/neuter. We request a small donation for these surgeries to cover our costs.



HOW DO I HELP?

The Feral Cat Spay/Neuter Project relies on donations and the efforts of our volunteers to maintain free services. Since 1997, we have altered over 30,000 cats. Since moving in 2003, we alter over 8000 cats per year. But we need your help to continue.

Donations. The direct cost for each surgery is approximately \$17. Your tax-deductible donation helps us save lives through prevention by increasing spay/neuter of free roaming cats. Please complete the form in this brochure and return with your gift.

Volunteer. Volunteers are the backbone of our work. We need volunteers in the clinic, on the phone lines, for community boothing and education, fund-raising assistance and more. We can use your time and talents on many projects. Please contact us for details.

Help spay/neuter a colony. If you know of a colony that you would like to manage, please contact us for more information about trapping, clinic dates, low-cost surgery options and more. We do not offer foster, trapping or relocation services.
