**Seattle, WA** – October marks the month for National Feral Cat Day and this year the Feral Cat Spay/Neuter Project is kicking it off with their 2<sup>nd</sup> annual “Sexless in Seattle” neuter event. It’s more than just a cat call it’s collaboration with King County Animal Services to promote altering of cats to reduce the number of homeless cats that arrive in the shelter each year. The Feral Cat Spay/Neuter Project will be conducting the surgeries using the KCAS facility in Kent.

On Saturday, October 7<sup>th</sup> the Feral Cat Spay/Neuter Project will alter the first 100 male cats to check in at the KCAS clinic in Kent. Rabies and feline distemper/upper respiratory vaccines for these cats will also be available for \$5 each and a free microchip will also be given with every new King County pet license. Check in begins at 8:00am.

The Feral Cat Spay/Neuter Project, a not for profit organization that is committed to reducing the number of homeless cats and ending euthanasia of cats in shelters in the Puget Sound region by providing safe and humane spay/neuter services for feral cats free of charge. “This year we have already conducted over 6,000 spay/neuter surgeries making us once again a leader in WA state for conducting the most surgeries” said Julie White - Executive Director. “By altering these tame male cats we are focusing on prevention which is the most effective and far reaching in reducing the number of homeless cats.”
